

This evening a large turnout of VVVC members and local veterans attended an open meeting hosted by Congresswoman Julia Brownley and the top executives of the WLA GLA Ann Brown and Robert McKendrick.

The first thing shared was the timeline for the new VA clinic now federally funded for Ventura County. The current status is proposals for available land is being published, then many steps in planning, design, and location will follow but the BIG news, the clinic is expected to be up and running in 2021.

The forum allowed for many questions to be asked and answered along with being able to share issues with the Congresswoman and the VA staff personnel. Some of what was shared and discussed included:

Local transportation issues to Oxnard CBOC with DAV looking to be able to be a big part of the solution if issues of formal documentation requirements might be done locally instead of WLA only.


The biggest discussion was over the inability to phone the Oxnard CBOC. Though there was an attempt to defend the new phone system, the final tally seemed to be that much has been done as it relates to Sepulveda and WLA, but uniformly the veteran presence was in total agreement that there was NO ability to contact Oxnard CBOC by phone and the VA leaders present promised to look into it.

Julia reiterated the position taken nationally by veterans on the Choice program. The consensus across the U.S. is that veterans do not want the VA healthcare system privatized.

It was announced that there would be an open forum on claims on Feb 1st.

The large turnout was treated to a very good open discussion about the local issues related to the Oxnard CBOC, and was appreciative of the efforts to respond and allow for the input.

I thank the Congresswoman for her continued good faith efforts to assist the local veteran population but even more so to keep us informed by providing access to the highest levels of the WLA VA.

On February 21, 2018, at 11 am-1 pm (program starts at 11:15 am) you're invited to the Ormond Beach VILLAS Groundbreaking Event-Ventura County's first permanent affordable housing for veterans at the Ormond Beach Villas, 5527-5567 S Saviers Rd, Oxnard, CA 93033. Ormond Beach Villas is a new construction development consisting of five three story buildings, totaling 40 units. The site is 1.81 acres and is currently vacant. Located on Saviers Rd. near Hueneme Rd. in Oxnard, the site is within walking distance to Southwinds Park, Art Haycox Elementary School, Perkins/Hueneme Bus Stop, Clinicas Maravilla, and is also 1.5 miles from the Naval Construction Battalion Center in Port Hueneme. There will be 8 units reserved for chronically homeless

veterans, 10 units for homeless veterans with a disability and 21 units will be reserved for low and very low income veteran families.



Who is SheerID?

What kind of proof do you require?

We accept a wide variety of readily available and approved forms of documentation. We are looking for official documentation that clearly shows your first and last name, a date of birth or discharge/retire date, and a clear affiliation with the military. We strongly suggest any documentation sent to us have sensitive information blacked out before it is uploaded to our system. Uploading documentation to us is optional, but without something to verify your credentials, we will be unable to successfully complete your request.

Currently, this offer is only being verified via our online verification service. Our safe and secure process is the fastest way to complete your verification and successfully access your offer. If you have extenuating circumstances, please contact us via our contact form.

Our organization represents all veterans (not just Vietnam Veterans) in the 805.

Our organizations primary function is to act as a 'service' group providing all manner of assistance to our veteran population. We are active in the education of our youth in our local schools by speaking at the schools to the students. We support and provide college scholarships every year. We have been the organization responsible for bringing the 'Traveling Wall' Vietnam Memorial to Ventura six times in the last 30 years and are planning on doing so again in 2018. We provide full military honor and color guards in parades and at funerals. We work closely with literally hundreds of other organizations and our elected officials both State and Federal in the county to see veterans' needs are met.

Our group runs around 130 strong, most living in Ventura, but some as far away as Australia and Canada. We are asking for donations to our cause, by selling advertising space in our newsletter.
