The identification of 338 individuals, to date, represents the first successful completion of a project of such scope and complexity. Nearly 86% of unknowns from the USS Oklahoma have been individually identified and it is expected that 90% will be identified by the end of the project,

surpassing the original projected estimate of 80%.

"Even more remarkable than the collective success of this project are all the families who were able to receive the remains of their loved one, whose last measure of devotion was made aboard the Oklahoma," said Kelly McKeague, DPAA's Director.

Currently there are 72,458 Americans (approximately 26,000 are assessed as possibly-recoverable) still unaccounted for from World War II

Korean War: 1

Army Cpl. Clifford S. Johnson, 20, of Valatie, New York, was accounted for April 16, 2020.

Currently there are 7,542 Americans still unaccounted for from the Korean War.

Vietnam: 1

U.S. Naval Reserve Cmdr. Paul C. Charvet, 26, was accounted for March 1, 2021.

Currently there are 1,571 American servicemen and civilians still unaccounted for from the Vietnam War

Iraq Theater & Other Conflicts: 6

Operation El Dorado Canyon, 1986 MIA: 1

Capt. Paul F. Lorence, of San Francisco, U.S. Air Force, was lost on April 15, 1986, over Libya.

Operation Desert Storm, 1991 MIA: 2

Lt. Cmdr. Barry T. Cooke, of Austin, Texas, U.S. Navy, was lost on Feb. 2, 1991, in the Persian Gulf. Lt. Robert J. Dwyer, of Worthington, Ohio, U.S. Navy, was lost on Feb. 5, 1991, in the Persian Gulf.

MSSING MAN TABLE

The missing man table consists of the following elements:

A small table set for one, symbolising the isolation of the absent service member.

The table is round to represent the everlasting concern the survivors have for the missing.

A white tablecloth to symbolise the pure intentions of the service members who responded to the country's call to arms.

A single rose in the vase symbolising the blood that service members have shed in sacrifice to ensure the freedom of the United States of America.

The yellow ribbon represents the family and friends who keep the faith while awaiting the return of the missing service members.

A slice of lemon on the bread plate that represents the bitter fate of the missing.

Salt sprinkled on the bread plate that symbolises the tears shed by waiting families.

An inverted glass to represent the fact that the missing and fallen cannot partake.

A Bible represents the spiritual strength and faith to sustain the lost.

A lit candle symbolises a light of hope that lives in hearts to illuminate the missing's way home.

An empty chair to represent the absence of the missing and fallen.
