President's Message:

bringing the Wall to Ventura in June, shortly after celebrating Memorial Day on May 28th. We must not forget, nor allow others who benefit from the sacrifices of the fallen to forget, the "full measure of devotion" shown by those whose names are on the Wall. I have been to the Vietnam Memorial in Washington as well as the memorial to WWI. II and Korea. There is one memorial at the Arlington National Cemetery in Virginia that represents the fallen from all our wars. We know it as the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. President Warren G. Harding presided over the dedication of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier on November 11, 1921. It was an emotion filled day. President Harding addressed the large crowd in attendance stating that the memorial was not just about one man. "He might have come from any one of millions of American homes... hundreds of mothers are wondering today, finding a touch of solace in the possibility that the nation bows in grief over the body of one she bore."[1] One writer for the Washington Post, George Roithwell Brown wrote: "No man had ever given more...youth, fortune, love and fame, his very identity flung away for the country's sake at the cannon's mouth, and in exchange an immeasurable immortality, the laurels of the victor, the veneration of the world the homage of civilization."[2] He went on to describe the two days of dedication as: "An overwhelming manifestation of love and adoration such as this republic has never seen before." Since 1921 three more crypts were added to include unidentified dead from the Second World War, the Korean War and the Vietnam War. Thanks to DNA testing, the Vietnam soldier was identified as United States Air Force First Lieutenant Michael Joseph Blassie and his remains were returned to his family in 1998.[3]

It is my hope that all who attend our presentation of the Vietnam Wall Memorial would have the same experience of "an overwhelming manifestation of love and adoration" for those whose name we know and recognize.










Faster VA claims decisions. VA



If your service-connected condition has gotten worse and you're planning to file an increased disability claim for that condition, there's a better way to file. Get the fastest decision on your claim for an increase by filing it as a Decision Ready Claim (DRC). Filing as a DRC means you can get a decision within 30 days after your claim is submitted.

Work with an accredited Veterans Service Organization (VSO) or other accredited representative to determine if the DRC program is right for you and your claim for an increase. Your VSO can then help you gather and submit all relevant and required evidence so your claim is ready for VA to make a decision when you submit it.

Don't need to file a claim for an increase? You can also file these other types of compensation claims through the DRC program:

- Direct Service Connection Claims
- Presumptive Service Connection Claims
- Secondary Service Connection Claims
- Dependency and Indemnity Compensation for surviving spouses
