President's Message:

On August 18th I had the honor of working the VVVC table at the Wings Over Camarillo air show. On that Saturday Ed Evans, David Ha, Howard Tench, Debora Ehrich and I met with a number of veterans. I want to thank Howard and Manuel Gonzales for setting up the tables and providing cold water for us. I was not able to attend on Sunday but I want to thank those who participated. One of the highlights for me on Saturday was the static line jump of the nine paratroopers. It brought back some good memories. I really enjoyed jumping when I was stationed at Fort Campbell, KY in 1967. While there I jumped out of C-119s, C-130s and C-141s. The best jump I had was a night jump from a C-141. I tell the students we get to share with each year, "Being a paratrooper is the best thing you can do with your pants on".

At our September 15th meeting we will begin our nomination process as per our bylaws. A nomination **does not** need to be seconded. Our election will be held in our December 15th meeting.

Nominations and Salutations for Votes

[A] All nominations of qualified candidates for election to the Executive Board shall be taken from the floor of the general meeting at least 90 days before the date of any election.

[B] Nominees must confirm willingness to serve.

[C] Subject to the time frame established in Article VII, Section 1 (A), any member, in person or by proxy, may place names in nomination.

Qualifications

[A] Must be a current member of the corporation in good standing.

[B] Must present a professional attitude and positive image at all times when representing the corporation.

[C] Other special membership requirements are as follows:

(1) Up to, but not to exceed 40% of the Executive Board may be Informal members.

(2) A minimum of 60% of the Executive Board shall be Formal members.

(a) The President must be a War Zone Veteran.

Membership Qualifications

There shall be two (2) classes of membership in this corporation; Informal Individual and Formal Individual. Application with payment of dues shall be presented to the Executive Board by the membership chair for review and approval.

[A] Any person eighteen years of age or older, of good moral character and dedicated to the purposes of this corporation shall be eligible for Informal Individual membership.

[B] Any person shall be eligible for Formal membership provided that he or she is a Vietnam War/Era Veteran (with active service between January 1, 1959 and May 7, 1975). A copy of discharge form DD-214 is required for proof of service.

[C] Any applicant under question may be asked to submit reasons for acceptance to the Executive Board.

Operation Iraqi Freedom, 2003-2010 MIA: 3



Scanning of Important Documents

Because of various life changing events, i.e. fires, death of veterans, misplacing of important papers, etc., it has become evident to me that the need to scan important documents have become very important. Therefore, I have begun to start this task. The following are some of the requirements. On the back of this sheet is an index outlining the sections with suggested documents. NOTE: Section 7 is a listing of various VA Forms that are fillable and may or may not pertain to you, but will be provided to you.

Ensure that all documents are free from staples, paper clips and binders. Also that they are removed from plastic sleeves or other sheet protectors.

I can come to your place or if this is not possible, I can meet you at a local library near you. This process should take approximately 1 hour depending how many documents you have. Those individuals that are not here locally (Ventura County), you can possibly send me your documents(not originals) to me, I can scan them and then return them back to you with you providing a self-addressed stamped mailing envelope. Please do not fold papers, it makes it difficult to scan.

You must provide a thumb drive or external hard drive to capture these electronic document scans.

All documents will be scanned to PDF format.




