Army Air Forces 2nd Lt. **Porter M. Pile**, 24, of Harlingen, Texas, was accounted for Nov. 28, 2022.

Army Air Forces 1st Lt. George W. Winger, 25, was accounted for January 24, 2023.

*Army Pvt. Leroy M. Slenker, 28, who was captured and died as a POW during World War II, was accounted for Feb. 3, 2023.

USS Oklahoma: 0

Total from World War II: 3

Currently there are 72,240 Americans (approximately 26,000 are assessed as possibly-recoverable) still unaccounted for from World War II

Korean War: 1

Army Cpl. Donald L. Dupont, 22, was accounted for Jan. 24, 2023.

Helpful Resources:

- The VVVC Website: Note that the site is currently being updated.
- Steven Thompson and/or his staff from the Ventura CBOC will be attending our monthly meetings (third Saturday of each month). This will be your opportunity to bring up any issues or comments that you might have with the clinic.
- Now you can set up appointments with doctors outside of the VA system. Community providers (non-VA) will work with your VA medical facility to give you timely and appropriate care. Many of your medical records can be transferred to your My HealtheVet account. You will need to have the My HealtheVet Premium account to set it up.
- Veteran Peer Access Network: The LA County Department of Mental Health can support you. Mental health, substance misuse, housing assistance, workforce development and employment, healthcare, education, legal services, and social connection/recreation, all in one place. Call the Veteran Support Line, 1-800-854-7711 *3. Available 9am-8pm PT, 7 days/week.



- PACT ACT scams are out there! You can see them in social media posts, emails, even in TV commercials. These predatory companies charge absurd fees or require you to give them a portion of your benefits you may be entitled to. A bulletin about the PACT Act was added to last month's (January 2023) Listening Post. Best to refer to that if you think you are entitled to file a claim.



The next morning (May 10th), I was hoping GQ would be over pretty soon but no such luck. Planes were being launched again, and we stayed at GQ for several more hours. After what seemed like an eternity, GQ was finally cancelled and I went back to my rack to try and catch a little shuteye. Couldn't really fall asleep though, just seems like once you're that tired it becomes a real challenge.

As a lowly Seaman, I wasn't privy to classified information. We always got daily briefings from our Captain over closed circuit TV of each day's bombing strikes, but this was different; we didn't hear any specifics. Maybe because the ship was actually at GQ, not sure. But I later learned what actually happened. The North Vietnamese had deployed a large squadron of MIG's to come out and attack the carrier group in retaliation for our attack and mining of Haiphong harbor, and there had been a heavy dogfight. In the end, there was a total of 11 confirmed kills of enemy MIG's but at the cost of 4 US planes. Turned out that it was the most significant dogfight of the entire Vietnam War. I'd say we won that one, but in light of the losses it didn't really feel much like a cause for celebration.
